Massive new reservoir to help alleviate Chicago area flooding

Local federal and environmental officials on Tuesday (9/1/15) heralded the completion of a new south suburban reservoir that will provide major flood protection to the area.

The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago cut the ribbon Tuesday morning at the Thornton Reservoir, which can hold 7.9 billion gallons of stormwater and sewage.
