Adoption of the Infiltration and Inflow Control Program and Training Workshops

Annual Reporting of Long-Term Operation and Maintenance Activities

On July 10, 2014, the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago's (MWRD's) Board of Commissioners adopted a new Infiltration and Inflow Control Program (IICP) in response to special conditions required by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Illinois EPA (IEPA) in the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permits issued for MWRD's Water Reclamation Plants (WRPs). The new IICP requirements have been incorporated into the Watershed Management Ordinance (WMO) as described below. Prior to the adoption of the new IICP, local sanitary sewer owners were required to rehabilitate their sewers as required under Article 6.5 of the MWRD Manual of Procedures for the Administration of the Sewer Permit Ordinance.

The MWRD Annual Status Report, Volume No. 42, covering the 12-month period ending September 30. 2014, is available at ii.mwrd.org for your review. The goal of the local sanitary sewer rehabilitation program is the removal of infiltration and inflow (I/I) to prevent basement backups (BBs) and sanitary sewer overflows (SSOs), and to reduce extraneous clearwater flows transported to WRPs for treatment.

The majority of local agencies owning/operating sanitary sewer systems have successfully completed sanitary sewer rehabilitation programs to achieve technical compliance as required by Article 6.5 of the MWRD Manual of Procedures for the Administration of the Sewer Permit Ordinance. MWRD continues to work with the remaining four agencies that have not yet achieved technical compliance with the ordinance. Consistent with MWRD's mission of protecting the water environment and protecting public health and safety, and with the federal Clean Water Act and MWRD's National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permits, MWRD will continue to require effective maintenance and management of local/satellite sanitary sewer systems tributary to its treatment plants.

Adoption of the Infiltration and Inflow Control Program (IICP)

The EPA and IEPA imposed special conditions in the NPDES permits issued on January 1, 2014, for MWRD's WRPs. The special conditions require MWRD to implement measures over and beyond the 1985 Sewer Summit Agreement if excessive I/I in the system causes or contributes to SSOs and/or BBs, and adopt a Capacity, Management, Operation and Maintenance (CMOM) program for its own wastewater collection/conveyance and treatment facilities. Due to this mandate, MWRD incorporated an updated Infiltration/Inflow Control Program (IICP) that was developed with the help of an Advisory Technical Panel (ATP) into the Watershed Management Ordinance (WMO). The new ordinance language was adopted by MWRD's Board of Commissioners on July 10, 2014 and is currently effective.

MWRD is continuing to work with the ATP in preparing an update to the WMO Technical Guidance Manual (TGM), to provide assistance in developing a program to comply with the IICP requirements. The TGM and accompanying IICP forms are available at <u>ii.mwrd.org</u>.
