## Thomas Kunetz, MWRD Asst. Director of Engineering, elected as Water Environment Federation Trustee during WEFTEC

Thomas Kunetz, MWRD Asst. Director of Engineering, was recently elected to begin serving a three year term as a trustee with the Water Environment Federation (WEF). His nomination to the Board of Trustees was approved by WEF's House of Delegates at their annual meeting at WEFTEC 2013 in October.

Headquartered in Alexandria, VA, WEF was founded in 1928 and is a not-for-profit technical and educational organization. It has 36,000 individual members and 75 affiliated Member Associations representing a diversity of water quality professionals including scientists, engineers, regulators, academics, utility managers, plant operators, and other professionals around the world.
