AAAEA President Alkhatib presents Public Service Award to MWRD Commissioner Spyropoulos

During the Arab American Association of Engineers and Architects (AAAEA) 17th annual awards dinner in Oak Brook last month, Illinois chapter president Anas Alkhatib presented Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (MWRD) Chairman of Finance Mariyana Spyropoulos with the Public Service Award, honoring her for her hard work on behalf of Cook County taxpayers and her commitment to civic engagement.

"We were excited to have Commissioner Spyropoulos at our annual dinner because she is dedicated and very well respected among her peers," said President Alkhatib. "We enjoyed her presentation, and everyone learned something new about the MWRD. Having her participate was a win-win for the Association."

Commissioner Spyropoulos used historical photos dating back to 1867 to explain the history of the MWRD, which was enacted by the Illinois General Assembly as a special purpose agency in 1889. She discussed how the MWRD constructed the Chicago Sanitary and Ship Canal to reverse the Chicago River in 1900 to protect Lake Michigan, considered one of the greatest engineering achievements in history. She also discussed the agency's role as the county's wastewater treatment and stormwater management organization.
