# MWRD honors Horizon Science Academy-Belmont for academic progress

The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (MWRD) Board of Commissioners recently welcomed students and staff from Horizon Science Academy-Belmont to its Board room to honor the students for their significant academic progress.

Horizon Science Academy-Belmont is part of Concept Schools, a Chicago-based, non-profit educational management and consulting organization whose goal is to create nationally recognized urban charter schools that stimulate high student achievement while improving the surrounding communities. In September, 25 percent of students met or exceeded state standards on the CSAT. When the tests were taken again in December, 61% of students met or exceeded state standards. Students' scores in both math and reading improved over the same period, and the school earned first place in the Concept Schools Spelling Bee.

"The students were very excited to be honored," said Principal Serdar Kartal. "Most of them had never been to a Board meeting, let alone been applauded at one."
