The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (MWRD) will be providing a midpoint review of the McCook Reservoir and Centennial Trail improvements project. The meeting will be held at 6 p.m. on Monday, May 19, 2014 at the Willow Springs Community Center, 8156 Archer Ave., Willow Springs.

Landscape architect firm Burns and McDonnell have updated the plans based on comments received at the last public meeting, and those revisions will be presented. Some of the updates include constructing two hills and adding a hiking trail to the look-out location.
