## Commissioners salute Irish American Hall of Fame inductees

The Board of Commissioners of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (MWRD) honored the Irish American Hall of Fame's (IAHOF) latest class of inductees with a resolution at its April 9 Board meeting.

The Irish American Hall of Fame will introduce its inductees at an Awards Gala and dinner on April 25, at the Irish American Heritage Center, 4626 N. Knox Ave. Several inductees from this year's class have significant ties to Chicago, such as Bob Newhart, Sister Sheila Lyne, Justice Anne McGlone Burke, the Rev. Jack Wall and the late Mother Frances Xavier Warde. Other inductees include: film director John Huston, actor and entertainer Gene Kelly, golfer Ben Hogan and geneticist and Director of the National Institutes of Health Francis Collins. For his advocacy for immigration reform and contributions to the local Chicago economy, Billy Lawless will receive the 2015 Hometown Hero Award.

"Through their various contributions, each of these individuals have left an imprint on Chicago from where they came from to where they have gone," said

This year's group will bring the total number of inductees to 51.
