The MWRD is hosting a "Celebration of STEM" event to honor Chicago Public and Non-Public science fair participants. The celebration begins with a mini-science fair expo at 9 a.m. where honorees will showcase their research to MWRD experts in the fields of wastewater treatment and stormwater management followed by the award ceremony at 10 a.m. The students and their guests will then attend a STEM career presentation by Principal Environmental Scientist Geeta Rijal, Ph.D., RM, BCES, who will discuss her role and her journey to becoming an expert in the field of microbiology.

The MWRD's "Celebration of STEM" event brings young scientists and environmental enthusiasts face-to-face with the people working both behind the scenes and at the forefront of wastewater treatment to protect the region's water supply source, Lake Michigan.

These students, ranging in grades seven to 12, participated in the annual Chicago Public or Non-Public Schools science fairs held in March at the Illinois Institute of Technology and the Museum of Science and Industry. The MWRD selected the 50 winning students based on their research in the categories of Environmental Science and Ecology.

The MWRD has participated in the Chicago Public and Non-Public Schools' annual science fairs for over 20 years, bringing recognition to the students' achievements in their research while also educating winners about the direct impact their studies could have on the water sector.
